Dear Co-laborers in Christ,

The Psalmist says, Ps 105:1” O give thanks unto the LORD; call upon his name: make known his deeds among the people.” As I sit down to write this letter I have just returned from another trip to Grenada. I want to take a few lines and just give thanks unto the Lord. The Lord moved in a great way and I give Him thanks and praise His name. I had the opportunity to preach twice in Richmond Hill Prison while I was there. **We saw nine men trust Christ in the prison.** We held a meeting for Pastor Houston in Happy Hill. We had a great meeting with good attendance each night. We were blessed to have the support of many of the other Independent Baptist Churches in the Island: what a blessing to see the men there working together. That was a blessing that we enjoyed when we lived there and we hoped to encourage the men to continue the same working together. **During this meeting we saw nine people making professions of faith in Christ.** One night God showed up in a special way and even after the service was ended, people were still getting saved. We saw an Older Catholic lady accept Christ, a Rasta man accept Christ, three men who were from a very ruff section of Grenada known for gangs etc. came and gave their life to Christ. **Praise the Lamb of God** The building could only hold about 50 people so many nights there were as many or more outside the building as there were inside and to see them coming from outside during the invitation to get help what a blessing to see God move in the island. I had a wireless mike so I was able to preach outside as well as inside, what a privilege to serve God in this way. We were able to go visit in the village of Happy Hill and invite people to church and to Christ.

Here in the states we have been in two more orientations for new prisons, at Mt. View Correctional and Craggy Correctional. We are hoping to get into these units on a regular basis next year. Pastor Chip Stowe also invited me to go with him to Gaston jail and I have had the privilege to go with him three times in the last two months. **In these meetings we saw 15 men make professions of faith in Christ.** For many of these men they are fresh off the street and more open to the gospel than at a later time. I am thankful for the open door to work with this good Pastor and try to reach these men.

We have also been in 10 of our regular units as well these two months. We held our first revival in Livesay Correctional in S.C. last month. We are on the schedule there now for next year once each month and two revivals. God is still opening doors for us to minister to these men and we need your help. The hours are sometimes long but the blessings are out of this world. In these ten units we saw **14 more men make professions of faith in the Lord.** Truly these two months give us much to Praise God for.

We also ask you to please keep us in your prayers for our needed support. We want to do all we can in these days for our Lord. I want to thank all of you that have supported us this year and for the new ones coming on board to help. We write these letters to let you know what God is doing with your mission money through our ministry. We have had again these days others talk of helping us in monthly support. Thank you in advance for your concern and consideration of our support. I also want to say thank to all that sent a special offering or a onetime gift they have helped make the difference in our ministry to the inmates and the two mission trips we have made this year. **Again Thank you.**

Please pray for my wife, she fell here at home while I was in Grenada and sprained her knee. She is presently on crutches and in pain, So I am trying to take care of her and the house as well as the ministry. We are thankful that it was not broken. Also remember my mom she is still very sick, she cannot seem to get better.
